FY23 Municipal Planning Grant Projects

Municipal Planning Grants support local planning and community revitalization initiatives that ready projects for implementation, build strong communities and improve Vermont's quality of life. Grants are awarded annually and administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development. Since 1998, the program has provided over \$14 million to 237 cities and towns. This year, \$598,997 was awarded to 29 municipalities including 1 consortium. The winning FY23 projects are described below.
