FY25 Municipal Planning Grant Projects

<u>Municipal Planning Grants</u> support local planning and community revitalization initiatives that ready projects for implementation, build strong communities and improve Vermont's quality of life. Grants are awarded annually and administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development. Since 1998, the program has provided over \$16 million to 242 cities and towns. This year, \$1,002,329 in Municipal Planning Grants were awarded to 46 municipalities, including one consortium. The winning FY25 projects are described below.
