Paul Carnahan, Historian, Montpelier. Mr. Carnahan was the Librarian of the Vermont Historical Society (VHS) from 1990 to 2022. At the VHS he aided historic preservationists and other researchers. In 2000 he was involved in planning the preservation and reuse of Barre's Spaulding Graded School as the VHS's Vermont History Center. He is the compiler of a monthly "Then and Now" column in the Montpelier Bridge and serves on Montpelier's Historic Preservation Commission and on the board of the Montpelier Historical Society. He is a past member of the Capitol Complex Commission and the Vermont Historical Records Advisory Board and a former president of New England Archivists. Mr. Carnahan is co-author of Montpelier: Images of Vermont's Capital City (2008). He has a BA in history and political science from Swarthmore College and an MLS from the University of Chicago. He recently uncovered an album of photographs documenting changes to the built environment that he created as a high school student in Brattleboro in the 1970s.
