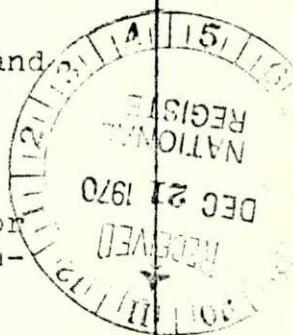

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ethan Allen Firehouse is constructed of red sand stone and brick, has 3½ floors with basement and a 85' hose drying tower topped by an open belfry.

This building is unaltered in appearance from its original design and with the exception of being well weathered, retains its original condition. The interior is in need of complete refurbishing but otherwise is unaltered from its last use as a fire station.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Ethan Allen Fire Station was built in 1887 to house the Ethan Allen Fire Company, a private fire company that was later incorporated into the city fire department. Building was designed by architect A.B. Fisher. The architectural style of the building is in the tradition of H.H. Richardson and also what is sometimes called the "Nineteenth Century Commercial Style".

The red sandstone and brick building has three and one half floors with basement and an 85 foot hose drying tower topped by an open belfry. The original cost was approximately \$15,000.

The original use was to house the complete operations of a horse drawn fire company, and later motorized fire apparatus. More recently it was occupied by the Burlington Police Department. It has been virtually vacant for about two years and planned for demolition.

The Ethan Allen Fire Station is an important part of the history of Burlington and it remains a symbol of the social and cultural heritage of that city as well as the state. It is acknowledged that such symbols tend to enrich the overall fabric of the urban environment.

The Ethan Allen Fire Station is an excellent example of the architecture of its period and its retention is of historic value.

The Ethan Allen Fire Station is an important component of the design of two significant urban spaces of the City of Burlington, namely as part of the facade of Church Street and its prominent position on the City Hall Park, and makes a positive contribution to visual character of these spaces in terms of its volume, scale, colour, texture, and detail.

The Ethan Allen Fire House is an outstanding example of 19th Century Commercial architecture. Few important buildings of this style have survived in the urban and rural area of Vermont.

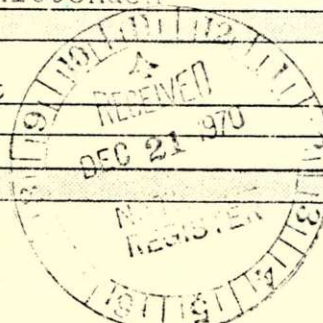
