#### **CRITERION 5: LONG TERM USE**

**5A.** <u>Briefly</u> describe the building and give a <u>short</u> summary of the building's history. What was the original use of the building and what is the building's current use?

Centre Congregational Church has existed in downtown Brattleboro since 1816. Over time it grew and, by 1966, it was clear that an addition would be necessary to accommodate the burgeoning church school. Since that time, as in other congregations, the enrollment in the church school has declined. However, the building is still used for the current church school, various adult education programs, and, most importantly, the Centre for Children. The Centre for Children is a weekday child care program that typically enrolls 40 +- children from the community. It is one of the few programs available in our community that provides care for infants. 81% of the children enrolled are eligible for the federal free lunch program. Their lunches, as well as take-home meals for the weekends are prepared in the kitchen of Centre Church.

In addition to the programs described above, the building also provides space for several weekly AA meetings, and supports the Brattleboro Literary Festival,

Brattleboro School of Music concerts, Loaves and Fishes (a community meal program), and provides space for an office and choir materials.  Careful maintenance of the roof will allow all the programs described above to continue unabated in a healthful and supportive environment.
5B. Describe any substantial work that has been performed on the building in the last five years:  Major structural repairs on the building were completed in 2009. Also, a new heating system and upgrades to the electrical wiring including a fire alarm tied directly into the central fire station.
<b>5C.</b> What is the planned use of the building following this project? If the building is rehabilitated, will it have a new use? Describe changes that will be made to the building in order to accommodate this new use. Will these changes impact historic features?
Please see 5A. It is our hope that the building will continue to be safe and appropriate for the uses described in 5A. Repair of the roof will make this possible and will not impact the historic features of Centre Congregational Church.
<b>5D.</b> Describe any additional work that needs to be done following the completion of this project. Do you have a plan for routine maintenance and long-term preservation of the building? Under the supervision of the Committee for Buildings and Grounds, a part time janitor (20 hours per week) performs routine maintenance. A local plumbing contractor and an electrical contractor are on call to handle any upgrades or

emergency repairs. In addition the Buildings and Grounds Committee frequently organizes volunteer work groups for painting and cleaning projects.

Centre Congregational Church is open and used by an almost endless succession of groups and individuals, some of whom are described under 5A. Our Loaves and Fishes program provides mid-day meals for the homeless two days a week for an approximate total of 400 meals a week. We provide space for Carry Me Home, a group that is gathering clothing and goods for Syrian refugees. Three different AA groups meet weekly at the church. We function as a depot for distribution of food to the poor at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Smaller groups such as a women's choral group and the AAUW Book Sale move in and out of the building continually, making it truly a community resource. We are committed to maintaining the building in such a fashion that it can be of service to the community.

Our building is easily visible throughout the town. Indeed, it often functions as a landmark for those passing through the town. The church sits in the heart of downtown Brattleboro, across the street from the post office and next to the town-owned Gibson-Aiken recreational center, and is centrally located in the Designated Downtown District.

Younger members are fewer in number and are less able to contribute financially. We find ourselves with an historic building that requires constant attention in order to continue to serve not only our congregation but the larger community as well. As a congregation we are committed to community service and it is to that end that we apply for support in maintaining our building.
