What was the original use of the building and what is the building's current use?

The timber crib dam was built originally in 1890 to provide waterpower for two factories. The dam was restored in 1999 as a historic example of Timber Crib design which is the design of the dam today.

The dam provides a site of historic interest and is the site of the only swimming facility in Guilford.
