The Town of Moretown is applying for the VTrans Fall 2023 Transportation Alternatives (TAP) and Municipal Highway and Stormwater Mitigation Program Grant (MHSMP). This being said, we will be applying for TA funding. The project is located just off from Route 100B, which is a State maintained highway.

Here is a brief description of the proposed project:

Replacement of the existing Salt Shed that is 16'X16'x12', with no concrete pad or room for dry storage. The new structure will have a 12" concrete pad with a 4' overhang for storage in the back. The new shed will be 14'high which will allow the trucks to dump without damaging the facility. The old facility is ready to collapse which could allow the salt leachate to drain into the Mads River if it is not covered. A new facility with a new roof and pad should prevent any salt leachate into the Mad River. The new shed would be built with salt resistant materials which will give the shed at least a 20-year life expectancy.
