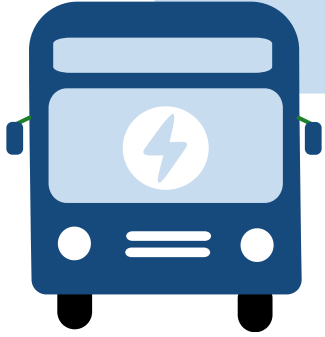


# CLIMATE ACTION IN VERMONT

## Transportation



As a rural state, Vermont's public transportation is limited. Vermonters mostly travel in their own cars. The fuels that power most cars—gasoline and diesel—release harmful pollution and greenhouse gases into the air. To do our part to make a difference for the climate and our health Vermont must lower transportation emissions, which are our state's largest source of climate pollution. At a systemic level, we can do this by transitioning to electric vehicles, creating micro-public transit for rural areas, making walking and biking easier, and living in villages and town centers.

### Benefits of changing how we travel

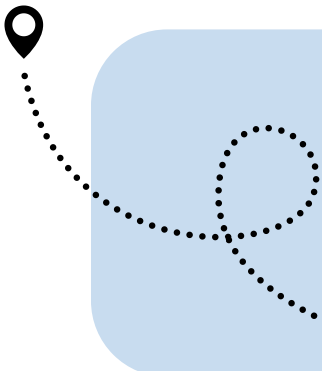


#### Money Saved

Buying an electric vehicle can be affordable with incentives (see reverse), and can save a driver \$1500 a year on fuel and car maintenance.

#### Access & Equity

When public transit is accessible, *everyone*, including our most vulnerable community members, can access resources and services.



#### Better Public Health

Electric vehicles reduce pollution in the air we breathe. This improves people's health.

#### Climate-Friendly

When cars run on electricity instead of gas, they make much less climate pollution.
