

Status of Legislative Action with ties to Climate Action

Bill	Summary	Next Steps
S.65 An act relating to energy efficiency utility jurisdiction	This bill proposes to amend the legislative direction to the Public Utility Commission to require the energy efficiency utilities to prioritize greenhouse gas emissions reductions. This bill also repeals the Affordable Heat Act.	Passed out of Senate Committees and up for vote in Senate
H.125 An act relating to reporting on the energy transition	This bill proposes to require the Climate Action Office to report on the economic impacts of the transition to clean energy within the State.	Passed out of House and in Senate Natural Resources and Energy
S.50 An act relating to increasing the size of solar net metering projects that qualify for expedited registration	This bill proposes to increase the size of solar net metering projects that qualify for an expedited approval process from 15 kW to 25 kW.	Passed out of the Senate and in House Energy and Digital Infrastructure
H.319 An act relating to miscellaneous environmental subjects	Includes repealing the requirement to adopt the Resilience Implementation Strategy by rule included in Act 122 last year.	Passed out of House and in Senate Natural Resources and Energy
H.289 An act relating to affordable climate initiatives	This bill proposes to change the Renewable Energy Standard to the Clean Energy Standard. It would also provide funding for electric vehicle incentives. It would also make multiple amendments to the Global Warming Solutions Act.	Substantive testimony being taken in House but outcomes this are unlikely and unclear
