Judy Dow led the Council in an exercise to produce the content for an updated land acknowledgment. Judy, the Climate Action Office, and a handful of councilors will develop a draft updated acknowledgement based on these inputs.

Councilors discussed the chapter review process, and the following next steps were identified:

- Many Councilors haven't received feedback on chapters yet.
- Richard Cowart will lead a group to look across the mitigation chapters and help develop a cohesive story line (note, the Top Priority Actions chapter will be drafted later)
- Jaiel Pulskamp and David Mears, with help from Ryan Patch or others, will work on combining the Ag & Ecosystem chapters
- The Climate Action Office and CBI can providing feedback to writers
- When we ask councilors to provide feedback, ideally lets find a way to aggregate the comments to avoid having multiple separate conversations
- The Council should acknowledge that it didn't have the time or information to provide detailed cost estimates
 - The Council's role is to recommend how to meet responsibilities cost-effectively and equitably, and that specific budgeting is for the legislature and administration.
- There has been a significant loss of federal and state funding avenues for resilience work and there is a concern that the Council may appear out of touch with reality if it doesn't address that.
- The Council should schedule time to develop language about funding / financing and consider how they connect to the way the Council develops priority actions.

Councilors reviewed the upcoming meetings, agreed with the proposal, and said time needs to be dedicated to:

- Just Transition chapter
- Discussion on funding

Annette Smith offered public comment that included:

• Concerns that representation from Addison and Rutland counties was low during a virtual input session, and many participants were the people already engaged in the work.

•	Urging that future sessions will focus on specific recommendations rather
	than provide general feedback.

• The Council lacks representation from Addison, Rutland, and Bennington counties, and there are important geographic differences that need to be addressed.

2:35 PM Summary of Written Public Comments David Plumb, CBI

David Plumb shared a summary of the written public comments received that included:

- A letter from the Vermont Interfaith Power and Light Board offered specific ideas on climate action ranging from transportation to the renewable energy portfolio standard.
- A letter from Local Motion encouraged actions to reduce vehicle miles traveled and invest in other transit options.
- Other comments included encouraging operational efficiencies over equipment and expressing concerns about electricity supply and the need to avoid fossil fuel generation if supply is reduced.
