

Transitional Housing

Transitional Housing refers to time-limited housing leased or owned by the grantee, where participants are not tenants but instead are enrolled in a program designated for serving the homeless in general or for a specific population of people experiencing homelessness.

Transitional Housing has been shown to be a successful model for specific subpopulations, such as unaccompanied youth, veterans, and those fleeing domestic violence. In general, HOP does not support Transitional Housing projects, except in limited circumstances when it is considered an appropriate intervention.

Transitional Housing Activities

1. **Operations** to maintain facilities providing transitional housing to eligible households.
2. **Essential Services** to provide coordination for households in transitional housing settings, ensuring basic needs are addressed and providing comprehensive referrals to mainstream services and benefits. See ***Case Management Service Definitions in Section 1 for more information.***
