Coordinated Entry

Coordinated Entry streamlines access to homeless assistance services and programs by conducting initial eligibility screening of applicants for these and other programs using a consistent and well-coordinated approach, assessing their needs to determine which interventions are the best fit, and prioritizing applicants for services. Coordinated Entry is implemented by the whole continuum (not just at a program or organization level) and is based on the policies and processes adopted by either the Chittenden County Homeless Alliance (CCHA) or the Vermont Coalition to End Homelessness (VCEH).

HOP-funded Coordinated Entry services must be provided in accordance with HUD's CoC Program Interim Rule as it relates to Supportive Services Only (SSO) projects (24 CFR Part 578).

Coordinated Entry Activities

- 1. Intake & Assessment Services to provide coordination at the program or community level. See Case Management Service Definitions in Section 1 for more information.
- 2. Housing Navigation Services to provide logistical and housing support to households preparing to move into permanent housing. *See Case Management Service Definitions in Section 1* for more information.
