

Need help paying for child care?

Child Care Financial Assistance for Vermont Families

The Child Care Financial Assistance Program (CCFAP) pays some or all of many Vermont families' costs for child care, preschool, and afterschool care.

CCFAP supports Vermont families so that Vermont's children, communities, and economy can thrive.

Is my family eligible?

Your family may qualify if you:

Have a reason for needing child care: You may have a job, be completing an education program, or have a child with special health needs. Find the full list of accepted reasons on the CCFAP webpage.

Meet income limits: Many Vermont families—even those with two caretakers working—are eligible for financial support. Visit the CCFAP webpage for current income guidelines.

Use regulated child care: Your children attend child care, preschool, or afterschool care licensed by the state of Vermont. In some cases, approved relatives may be eligible to receive payment for providing care.
