- 1. Relaxed Eligibility Criteria 12/1/2024 to 3/31/2025.
 - a. 1100 room cap is not in effect during this time period.
 - b. 80-night maximum eligibility does not apply during this time period.
 - i. Nights used between 12/1/2024 and 3/31/2025 do not count towards the 80-night maximum eligibility.
 - c. Categorical eligibility remains in effect.
 - d. The following is a link to the full description of eligibility from 12/1/2024 to 3/31/2025 Addressing and Preventing Unsheltered Homelessness | Department for Children and Families
- 2. ESD will begin processing authorizations for 12/1/2024 for households that have already exhausted their 80 nights beginning 11/18/2024.
 - a. Early authorizations will begin on 11/18/2024 to ensure a smooth transition for a rule change that occurs on the Sunday of a holiday weekend.
 - b. Early-authorizations are designed to facilitate housing placements for individuals eligible under the GA program who have exhausted their 80 nights and are experiencing unsheltered homelessness.
- 3. Outreach to Households
 - a. ESD will be conducting outreach to households that have been identified as unsheltered and have no housing options.
 - i. Typically identified through a Reach-up Case Manager, Field Services, or other information known to ESD.
 - b. ESD is requesting support from community partners in identifying households who are unsheltered, have no housing options, and otherwise qualify for the General Assistance emergency housing program.
 - i. ESD is exploring the opportunity to collaborate with partners that are interested in hosting an on-site Benefit Program Specialist to process applications and complete early authorizations.

 - ii. ESD is exploring the opportunity of setting appointment times with community partners to process applications and complete early authorizations.
 - Please contact the housing unit's management team at <u>AHS.DCFESDGAHManagement@vermont.gov</u> if you would like to set-up an appointment to assist households in applying for an early authorization.

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- c. ESD is requesting support in printing/posting fliers that provide information on how to apply for an early authorization.
 - i. Would like to post in food shelves, partner offices, libraries etc.
- d. ESD's housing call center will be open extended hours from 11/18/2024-11/27/2024.
 - i. Call center hours will be 8am to 6pm 11/18/24-11/27/2024.
- 4. Income Contribution
 - a. The income contribution for December will be delayed to mid-December for households that have exhausted their 80 nights.
 - i. This will allow households to enter housing on 12/1/2024
- 5. GA is a Shelter First Program
 - a. Households will be referred to open shelter space when space is available.
 - i. A Period of Ineligibility may be applied for refusing a shelter bed.
