Subject: Update on General Assistance Emergency Housing Program

Dear Health and Medical Community,

The Department for Children and Families (DCF) wishes to inform you that beginning July 1, 2025, the program will operate under eligibility criteria similar to last year, as established under Act 27 of 2025. You can view the act here:

Important Program Information

1. Rolling 80-Day Limit:

- Emergency housing assistance is limited to 80 days within a 12-month period, counted on a rolling basis. This means each day of assistance used in the past year counts toward the limit, regardless of the calendar year.
- Days spent in emergency winter housing from December 1 to March 31st do not count toward the 80-day limit.

2. Discontinuation of Medical Vulnerability Form (201G-MV):

- Starting July 1, 2025, the [medical vulnerability form](#) will no longer be used. It was previously required under the Governor's Executive Order 03-25, which expires on June 30, 2025.
- Please note, the Emergency Housing Disability Documentation Form ([201G-VR](#)) will continue to be used to document a qualifying disability or health condition under GA rule 2652.2. A health care provider who is licensed, certified, or otherwise authorized by law to provide professional health care services in Vermont must complete this form.

3. End of Governor's Executive Order 03-25:

- The executive order allowed certain households to receive more than 80 days of housing assistance. As of July 1, 2025, these households will no longer be eligible for extended assistance.

Current Impact:

- As of June 23, 2025, 385 households benefited from the extended assistance under the executive order. These households will no longer be eligible for housing assistance as of July 1, 2025.
- Additionally, there are 93 households not covered under the executive order who will also reach the end of their eligible assistance period by July 1, 2025.





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- Below is the data from 6/23/2025 on the number of all households, adults, and children affected in each district area. Please note that data for groups smaller than 12 is suppressed to protect privacy:
