P-2210 HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION (continued)

P-2210H Three or more Parent Household (20-02)

Households where three or more parents are living together must apply for Reach Up benefits together.

Example:

Sam and Pat have a daughter, Anna. Sam and Blake have a son, Jon.

The three adults (Sam, Pat and Blake) live together with the two children (Anna and Jon).

Since Anna and Jon are half-siblings, the household would have to apply for Reach Up benefits together.

All three adults would have to sign Family Development Plans (FDPs), meet with a Case Manager and share the family work requirement.

BPS Support

For the example case above, ACCESS would have to be set up by coding the family members as follows:

Sam (Head of Household) code as "01" Self.

Pat code as "02" Spouse or Civil Union Partner or code as "03" Eligible Parent of the Applicant's Child, depending on if Sam and Pat are married.

Blake, code as "13" RUFA Essential Person.
