### **EXPUNGEMENT REVIEW**

You may request a review to have your name expunged (removed) from the registry once it's been on a certain number of years. How long you have to wait depends on:

- ▶ When you were substantiated, and
- ▶ Your child protection level (*if any*).

Read page 1 of the attached form to learn when you may request an expungement review. You may NOT request one while you're required to be on the sex offender registry.

### What happens if I request one?

- **1.** You'll get the chance to present information to a reviewer. They'll consider factors such as the:
  - ⇒ Nature & number of substantiations,
  - ⇒ Amount of time that's passed,
  - ⇒ Likelihood that it will happen again, and
  - ⇒ Things you've done to change.
- **2.** You'll be notified of the decision, which is made by the DCF Commissioner.
- **3.** If your request is denied, you may appeal to the Human Services Board.

### **REQUEST A REVIEW**

- **1**. Read page 1 of the attached form to learn if you may request one at this time.
- **2.** If you may, complete page 2 of the attached form.
- **3.** Answer the questions completely & accurately. We cannot process your request unless it's complete.
- **4.** Indicate the type of review you're asking for.

### You have the right to:

- ► Free interpretation services if you have limited English.
- ▶ Reasonable accommodations if you have a disability.



### Vermont's Child Protection Registry



When DCF investigates a report of child abuse or neglect, we must decide whether a reasonable person would believe that it happened. If the answer is YES, the report is substantiated and the person's name is added to the Child Protection Registry.

### What's in a registry record?

- **1**. The person's name.
- **2.** At least one other fact to help identify them (e.g., date of birth).
- 3. The date & nature of the finding.
- **4.** A child protection level related to their risk of future harm to children for all records added on or after July 1, 2009.

### Can the public access the registry?

No. But current or potential employers may access it if:

- ▶ The person being checked gives their permission, and
- ▶ The work involves children, youth or vulnerable adults.

### What if I get substantiated?

Your name will be added to the registry — unless you challenge the substantiation and get it overturned.

### How can a record affect me?

It could affect your ability to:

- ▶ Adopt a child,
- ▶ Become a child care provider,
- ▶ Provide foster/respite care, and
- Work or volunteer in positions involving children, youth or vulnerable adults.

Others may request your record if it's relevant. This includes:

- Adult/child protection agencies,
- ▶ Board of Medical Practice, and
- ▶ State's attorneys.

### SUBSTANTIATION REVIEW

If you were substantiated:

- ▶ From January 1, 1992 to August 31, 2007:
   You may request a review to challenge it at any time.
- ▶ On/after September 1, 2007: You may request a review to challenge it — within 14 days of when we mailed you a letter advising that:
  - ⇒ We intend to add your name to the registry.
  - ⇒ You have the right to request a substantiation review.

### What happens if I request one?

- **1.** We'll contact you to schedule a meeting with an independent reviewer.
- **2**. Once it's scheduled, we'll send you a confirmation letter and copies of redacted investigative documents (*per the law*).
- **3**. After the meeting, the reviewer may:
  - ⇒ Uphold the substantiation,
  - ⇒ Overturn it, or
  - ⇒ Direct DCF to reopen the investigation.
- **4.** You'll be sent a decision letter.
- **5.** If the reviewer upholds the substantiation:
  - ⇒ We'll add your name to the registry (or keep it on if it's already there).
  - ⇒ You may appeal the decision to the Human Services Board.

### If you don't request a review in the time allowed:

- ➤ Your name will be added to the registry (or stay if it's already there).
- ▶ The decision will be final and you'll have no further right to request a substantiation review.

If you were substantiated for behavior that happened before you were 10, your registry record will be automatically expunged when you turn 18 - as long as you have no additional substantiation: as long as you have no additional substantiations

If you were substantiated for behavior that happened before you were 18, you may request a review after your name has been listed on the registry for at least three years.
