It takes about 2 years to permit and build systems of the scale we need. We don't have enough roofs to supply our needs. We need residential and 5000 k net metering projects....hundreds of them and speed type projects also. If we think we will just buy the renewable power somewhere else at a later date, we give away the good paying jobs and send money out of state. That's the same foolish thinking that we employ when we buy oil and gas products from an out of state source. In addition good pricing will not come the longer we wait as we will be competing with other New England states who will be trying to shed their fossil fuel addiction at the same time. Further, I ask what has happened to the strategy of distributed generation? Depending on an out of state source, not to mention out of country, for our power goes back to the days of centralized generation which is so contrary to the concept of resiliency. We give icontrol of our own destiny.

A rethinking/reworking of this plan by the DPS is absolutely critical if we are ever to reach our 2030/2032 goals not to mention the long term goal of 2050. The plan smacks of 'stay the course thinking.' Those days are over with. We have the technology and the capacity to build in state, carbon free solar electricity right now.
