Reminder to All Justices of the Peace: If you are elected and you are not already serving as a JP, your TERM OF OFFICE does not begin until FEBRUARY 1 of the year following the General Election and runs for two years. YOU CANNOT PERFORM ANY JP DUTIES UNTIL AFTER FEBRUARY 1 (unless you are an incumbent).

NOTE: This oath is from the Vermont Constitution, Chapter II, §56. This oath may be given by, among others, a notary public (including the town clerk or any justice of the peace that has already filed a notary oath with the county clerk). Failure to file a copy of these oaths with the town clerk will prevent you from qualifying for office and may also subject you to a fine of not more than \$100.00. 4 V.S.A. § 492.
