How will I know if I win? If you provided contact information, the canvassing committee may contact you. You can also check the winner listing on the Secretary of State's website at Sos.Vermont.gov/Elections/Election-Info-Resources/Elections-Results-Data.

How does a write-in candidate win a primary election? You receive at least half the number of votes as the number of signatures required for that office on a primary petition and more votes than any other write-in candidate. Or you receive more votes than a candidate whose name is printed on the ballot. See how many votes you need to win at: Sos.Vermont.gov/Elections/Election-Info-Resources/Candidates.

If I win a primary election, will I automatically be added to the general election ballot? Before you can be added to the general election ballot, you must file a consent of candidate form, like all other candidates on the ballot.
