## TIPS FOR CLASSROOM VISITS

## FOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS





1. Ask the classroom teacher for students' questions ahead of time if possible. This allows you to focus on their interests, and to prepare high-quality responses.



2. **No need to do a stump speech!** Be mindful that this is not a campaigning event. It's OK to ask the educator whether it is permitted to leave printed materials.



3. Ask students questions about themselves! Dialogue with students rather than monologue. Ask their opinions about current legislation under debate, especially if it's in the news.



4. See it from their perspective.

Avoid using specialized jargon and acronyms and put yourself in the students' shoes - whether it's 1st or 11th graders, how can you translate your message into their terms?



5. Leave students with a positive message.

They are proud of their communities and are often looking for opportunities to participate and engage.
