STIPULATED VOLUNTARY SURRENDER OF LICENSE

STIPULATION

NOW COME the State of Vermont, by and through State Prosecuting Attorney Rachel Allen, and the Respondent, Sarah F. Benson, who stipulate and agree as follows:

Board Authority

1. The Vermont State Board of Nursing ("Board") has authority to issue warnings or reprimands; suspend, revoke, limit, or condition current licenses; or prevent the renewal of lapsed licenses if, after disciplinary hearing, the Board finds that the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct. 3 V.S.A. § 129(a); 3 V.S.A. § 129a; 3 V.S.A. § 814(d); 26 V.S.A. Chapter 28; the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing ("ARBN"); and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.

Stipulated Facts and Violation

2. Sarah F. Benson ("Respondent") of Putney, Vermont, is licensed by the State of Vermont as a Registered Nurse ("RN") under license number 026.0024192. This license was originally issued on July 31, 1998, and is currently set to expire on or about March, 31, 2019.
3. On June 15, 2015, the Board approved a Reinstatement and Modification Stipulation and Consent Order ("Order").
4. The Order allowed for the reinstatement of Respondent's RN license and placed conditions on that license for a minimum of four (4) years. *See Attachment A.*
5. Stated in Paragraph 3, the Order required Respondent to enter and continue substance abuse counseling and comply with a substance abuse treatment plan. Respondent was required to authorize her treating professional to submit monthly reports.
6. Respondent is not in compliance with required treating professional reports.
7. Stated in Paragraph 4, the Order required Respondent to submit to random drug and alcohol screenings at the request of the Board or its designee.

8. Respondent is not in compliance with required random drug and alcohol screenings due to an inability to pay for screenings.

Violation One: 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(4). Failing to comply with an order of the board or violating any term or condition of a license restricted by the board.

9. The State re-alleges and incorporates Paragraphs 2 through 8 above.
10. The facts alleged in Paragraphs 3 through 8 demonstrate that Respondent is not in compliance with the Order.
11. The act(s), omission(s), and/or circumstance(s) described above constitute grounds for discipline because the Respondent has committed unprofessional conduct in violation of 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(4).

Understandings

12. Respondent admits that the facts above are true and the parties reach a full and final Stipulation pursuant to these Understandings, the Acceptance of Voluntary Surrender, and Order below.
13. Respondent understands that the Board must review and accept the terms of the Stipulated Voluntary Surrender of License. If the Board rejects any portion, the entire Stipulated Voluntary Surrender of License shall be null and void.
14. Respondent specifically waives any claims that any disclosures made to the full Board during its review of this agreement have prejudiced her right to a fair and impartial hearing in the future if this agreement is not accepted by the Board.
15. Respondent has read and reviewed this entire document and agrees that it contains the entire agreement between the parties.
16. Respondent is not under the influence of any drugs or alcohol at the time she signs this Stipulated Voluntary Surrender of License.
17. Respondent voluntarily enters into this agreement after the opportunity to consult with legal counsel and is not being coerced by anyone into signing this Stipulated Voluntary Surrender of License.
18. Respondent voluntarily waives her right to a contested hearing before the Board of Nursing and waives any right to appeal from this Stipulated Voluntary Surrender of License.
19. Respondent agrees that the Acceptance of Voluntary Surrender and Order set forth below may be entered by the Board.

REINSTATEMENT AND MODIFICATION STIPULATION
AND CONSENT ORDER

STIPULATION

NOW COME the State of Vermont, by and through State Prosecuting Attorney S. Lauren Hibbert, and the Respondent, Sarah F. Benson, who stipulate and agree as follows:

Board Authority

1. The Vermont State Board of Nursing (the "Board") has authority to issue warnings or reprimands; suspend, revoke, limit, or condition current licenses; or prevent the renewal of lapsed licenses if, after disciplinary hearing, the Board finds that the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct. 3 V.S.A. § 129(a); 3 V.S.A. § 129a; 3 V.S.A. § 814(d); 26 V.S.A. § 1582; the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing (the "ARBN"); and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.

Statement of Facts

2. Sarah F Benson (the "Respondent"), of Putney, Vermont is licensed by the State of Vermont as a Registered Nurse under license number 026.0024192. This license was originally issued on or about July 31, 1998. This license was suspended by Stipulation and Consent Order on or about November 19, 2007, pursuant to Docket Number NU11-0803 due to failure to comply with drug and alcohol conditions. The Respondent is currently suspended.
3. Respondent is seeking reinstatement. Respondent has obtained an independent evaluation that states she is fit to practice if given a conditional license. The Investigatory Team is comfortable issuing her a conditional license.

Understandings

4. Respondent admits the facts above are true and that the conditions below are necessary to protect the public.

5. Respondent understands that the Nursing Board must review and accept the terms of the Consent Order. If the Board rejects any portion, the entire Stipulation and Consent Order shall be null and void.
6. Respondent specifically waives any claims that any disclosures made to the full Board during its review of this agreement have prejudiced her rights to a fair and impartial hearing in future hearings if this agreement is not accepted by the Board.
7. Respondent has read and reviewed this entire document and agrees that it contains the entire agreement between the parties.
8. Respondent is not under the influence of any drugs or alcohol at the time she signs this Stipulation and Consent Order.
9. Respondent voluntarily enters into this agreement after the opportunity to consult with legal counsel and is not being coerced by anyone into signing this Stipulation and Consent Order.
10. Respondent voluntarily waives her right to a contested hearing before the Board of Nursing and waives any right to appeal from this Stipulation and Consent Order.
11. Respondent agrees that the Order set forth below may be entered by the Board.

ORDER

Based on the Stipulation above, it is **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

- A. The Board of Nursing hereby **CONDITIONS** Respondent's license and/or re-entry permit. Respondent's license will be **CONDITIONED FOR A MINIMUM OF FOUR (4) YEARS** commencing with the date of reinstatement. The conditions will be as follows:
 1. Re-issuance of License. Upon the commencement of these conditions, Respondent shall be issued a license and/or re-entry permit and it shall be labeled "conditioned."
 2. Length of Time of Conditions Imposed. The conditions shall remain in place until Respondent has completed all conditions ordered. Respondent shall be subject to the conditions until Respondent completes a **minimum of four (4) years** of supervised nursing. **For the initial 18 months, Respondent is not permitted to work more than 24 hours/ week.** After 18 months Respondent is permitted to work full time and part time hours of fewer than forty (40) hours every two (2) weeks shall be credited on a prorated basis. At all times under this Order, Respondent shall be prohibited from working more than forty (40) hours per week.
 3. Completion of Substance Abuse Counseling, Treatment Plan, Treatment Reports and recovery groups. Respondent shall enter into and continue substance abuse

counseling and comply with substance abuse treatment plan until the pre-approved treating professional certifies in writing to the Board that such counseling is no longer necessary.

Respondent shall authorize Respondent's treating professional to submit to the Board **monthly** reports on forms issued by the Board. Respondent shall authorize Respondent's treating professional to provide all information requested by the Nursing Board, either orally or in writing, at any time during the period this Consent Order is in effect.

Respondent shall participate as recommended by Respondent's treating professional in substance abuse recovery group(s), and shall submit **quarterly** reports documenting such attendance on forms issued by the Board.

4. Random Drug and Alcohol Testing.

Respondent shall submit to random drug and alcohol screenings at the request of the Board or its designee. Respondent shall designate a person or entity that has been pre-approved by the Board or its designee to administer random drug and alcohol screens. All testing shall be done on a random, unannounced basis and analyzed by a lab qualified to analyze samples for forensic purposes and approved by the Board. All urine specimens collected for tests shall be collected in an observed setting. All screens shall be negative.

Failure to appear for, refusal to provide, adulteration of, dilution of, or tampering with a sample for any urine screen shall cause that screen to be presumed positive. Any positive screen shall constitute a violation of this Order.

5. Abstain from Drug and Alcohol Use. Respondent shall abstain completely from the consumption or possession of alcohol and drugs.

6. Drug Use Exception. Respondent may take scheduled/controlled medications lawfully prescribed for a bona fide illness or condition by a health care practitioner disclosed to the Board in writing by Respondent within forty-eight (48) hours of the prescription. Respondent health care practitioner shall inform the Board, in writing and on appropriate letterhead, of knowledge of Respondent's substance abuse issue(s) within seven (7) days of entering into the practitioner/patient relationship. Additionally, the practitioner shall inform the Board of all scheduled/controlled medications prescribed - and the anticipation of how long such prescriptions will need to be taken - within seven (7) days of the prescription.

The Board or its designee may request that the practitioner document the necessity for the prescribed scheduled/controlled medications or other medications known to have abuse potential. It is not anticipated that Respondent would be prescribed scheduled/controlled medication during the term of this Consent Order for a period greater than fourteen (14) days, but if so, then the conditions herein may be revoked by the Board.

Respondent shall provide the Board with a current medication list of any medications taken on a scheduled or as-needed basis on forms issued by the Board within seven (7) days of the date of reinstatement and shall update this list within forty-eight (48) hours of any change in these medications.

7. Notification to Employers/Nursing School. Respondent shall provide a copy of this Stipulation and Consent Order to all employers in any current or future setting in which Respondent practices as a nurse and inform them of Respondent's conditional license status. Within ten (10) days of the date of entry of this Consent Order or of any subsequent nursing employment, Respondent shall cause Respondent's immediate supervisor to submit to the Board an employer agreement form approved by the Board, acknowledging receipt of the Stipulation and Consent Order and the ability to comply with the conditions in the Consent Order.

In the event Respondent is attending a nursing program or re-entry program which has a clinical portion that involves actual patient care, Respondent shall provide a copy of the Stipulation and Consent Order to the Program Director. Respondent shall cause the Program Director to submit to the Board a nursing program agreement form approved by the Board, acknowledging receipt of the Stipulation and Consent Order and the ability of the program to comply with the conditions in the Consent Order during clinical experience.

8. Reports from Employers/Program Director. Within one (1) month of the date of reinstatement or within one (1) month of the commencement of nursing employment and monthly thereafter, Respondent shall cause every nursing employer Respondent has worked for during the month to submit to the Board an evaluation of Respondent's work performance and attendance during that month. Moreover, on a quarterly basis, these reports shall include the results of the employer's medication audits of Respondent's medication administration and practices. In the event Respondent is attending a nursing program, Respondent shall cause the Program Director to submit to the Board, on a monthly basis, a written evaluation of Respondent's performance and attendance. These reports shall be submitted in writing on forms issued by the Board. All employer reports shall indicate satisfactory performance (i.e., consistently meeting all standards of nursing practice) and attendance.
9. Practice Under Supervision. Respondent shall practice as a nurse only in a setting where Respondent has direct supervision for the entire shift by a licensed registered nurse that is in good standing with the Board.
10. Administration of Medications. Respondent is prohibited from administering any controlled substances. This condition may be removed only by Respondent filing a petition with the Board after Respondent has worked as a nurse for eighteen (18) months for at least forty (40) hours every two weeks (or the part time equivalent) after the date of reinstatement.

In any such petition, Respondent must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Nursing Board or its designee, that Respondent can safely and competently administer such medications. Respondent must include appropriate support from Respondent's treating professional and employer or nursing school administrator and a description of the documentation and inventory control procedures in place.

The removal of this prohibition shall not automatically result in the reinstatement of all medication privileges. The Board may gradually restore those privileges through whatever intermediary steps it determines are appropriate.

11. Types of Employment Prohibited. Respondent shall not work in a supervisory role. Respondent shall not work for a nurse registry, traveling nurse agency, float-pool, home health care agency, temporary nursing employment agency, or as a private duty nurse or personal care provider requiring a nursing or nursing assistant license during the effective period of this Consent Order.
12. Interview with the Board or its Designee. Respondent shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.
13. Out-of-State Practice. Before any out-of-state practice can be credited toward fulfillment of these terms and conditions, Respondent shall first obtain approval from the Board. The Board will approve out-of-state nursing practice so long as Respondent can still comply with the provisions of this Consent Order. If Respondent receives discipline on a nursing license held in another state during the conditioned period, Respondent must inform the Board of such, in writing, within ten (10) days of receiving such discipline.
14. Notification of Place of Employment/Personal Address/Telephone Number. Within ten (10) days of the date of entry of this Consent Order, Respondent shall notify the Board, in writing, of Respondent's current place of employment, personal address, and telephone number. Respondent shall further notify the Board, in writing, within forty-eight (48) hours of any change in employment (including resignation or termination), personal address, or telephone number.
15. Notification to Other States. In the event that Respondent is licensed in nursing in any other state(s), Respondent must inform the nursing licensing board of the state(s) in which Respondent is licensed of the conditional status of Respondent's Vermont nursing license within thirty (30) days of the date of entry of this Order.
16. License Renewal. This Order does not automatically extend the license and Respondent must comply with the requirements for license renewal.
17. Release of Information Forms. This Order requires Respondent to authorize drug and/or alcohol treatment providers to report information in verbal and/or written format and/or to discuss Respondent and any and all treatment rendered to

Respondent for drugs and/or alcohol with the Board or its designee. Any and all of this information may be provided to the Office of Professional Regulation investigators, and that the information may be used for further prosecutions if so warranted or if the Office of Professional Regulation determines that said information violates the terms of this Order or any rules or laws governing the profession of nursing.

Respondent is entitled to revoke this consent at any time. However, any revocation shall be considered a violation of this Order. This consent expires when the conditions are removed from Respondent's nursing license.

This Stipulation and Consent Order shall itself constitute a valid written consent pursuant to the requirements of 42 C.F.R. § 2.31. Respondent understands that Respondent's treatment provider may require Respondent's to sign a separate and distinct consent meeting the requirements of 42 C.F.R. § 2.31.

18. Costs. Respondent shall bear all costs of complying with this Consent Order.
 19. Violation of this Order. If Respondent violates this Order the Board, after giving Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard, may rescind or modify this Order and impose additional appropriate disciplinary actions. If a complaint of unprofessional conduct is made against Respondent during the term of this Order, this Order shall be automatically extended until the unprofessional conduct matter is concluded.
 20. Completion of Conditional License Period. Respondent must petition the Board, or its designee, to remove any and all conditions on Respondent's license. Respondent must present proof that Respondent has fully complied with the terms of this Order. Respondent must also present proof of successful substance abuse rehabilitation, that Respondent poses no danger to the public or the practice of nursing, and that Respondent can safely and competently perform the duties of a licensed nurse.
- B. Notwithstanding any provision above, the Respondent must continue to meet all Board requirements for maintaining a license, license renewal and license reinstatement.
 - C. This Stipulation and Consent Order is a matter of public record and may be reported to other licensing authorities as provided in 3 V.S.A. §129(a).
 - D. This Stipulation and Consent Order will remain part of Respondent's licensing file and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.
