DEFAULT ORDER

The Board held a hearing on the above matter on February 14, 2011 at the National Life Building in Montpelier, Vermont. Ms. Goodell did not attend and was not represented by counsel.

Findings of Fact

1. Ms. Goodell is licensed as a registered nurse and is therefore subject to the regulatory authority of this Board. 3 V.S.A. §§ 129, 129a, 26 V.S.A. § 1582(a), the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing, and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.
2. On December 20, 2011 Ms. Goodell was sent a Notice of Charges in this matter by certified mail to her last known address. A copy of the Specification of Charges is attached to this Default Order.
3. OPR Rule 3.3 requires that an Answer be filed within 20 days of the date on which the notice of charges was mailed by the Director.
4. Licensees are required to notify the Board of any change of address within 30 days. 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(14).
5. The return receipt shows that Ms. Goodell received the Specification of Charges.
6. Ms. Goodell has not filed an answer to the charges.
7. On January 24, 2011 notice of the Default Hearing scheduled for this date was mailed to Ms. Goodell at that same address by certified mail. Ms. Goodell received the notice.
8. Ms. Goodell has still not answered the charges.
9. Upon hearing the State's presentation and taking notice of its own file, the Board finds Ms. Goodell to be in Default. The allegations contained in the State's Specification of Charges are therefore treated as the facts on which the Board's Order is based. OPR Rule 3.4, 3 V.S.A. § 809(d) and 3 V.S.A. § 814(c).

Conclusions of Law

Ms. Goodell has received adequate or constructive notice of the charges in this matter as

indicated by the Board's file and the State's presentation. Because Ms. Goodell has failed to answer the charges, the State's factual allegations are treated as if proved. O.P.R. Rule 3.4. Accordingly, the Board finds, in this Default Hearing held pursuant to 3 V.S.A. §809(d), that Ms. Goodell has engaged in the unprofessional conduct alleged in the State's Specification of Charges.

Order

In accordance with the above Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, Ms. Goodell's license is hereby **Suspended Indefinitely**, effective as of the date of the hearing. Should Ms. Goodell apply for reinstatement, the Board at that time will determine whether any conditions can permit her to resume practice while protecting public health and safety.

Appeal Rights

This is a final administrative determination by the Vermont Board of Nursing.

A party aggrieved by a final decision of a board may appeal this decision by filing a written Notice of Appeal with the Director of the Office of Professional Regulation, Vermont Secretary of State, National Life Bldg., North, FL2, Montpelier, VT 05620-3402 within 30 days of the entry of this order.

If an appeal is filed, the Director of the Office of Professional Regulation shall assign the case to an appellate officer. The review shall be conducted on the basis of the record created before the board. In cases of alleged irregularities in procedure before the board, not shown in the record, proof on that issue may be taken by the appellate officer. 3 V.S.A. §§ 129(d) and 130a.

SPECIFICATION OF CHARGES

NOW COMES the State of Vermont and makes the following Charges against the Respondent, Amy Joy Goodell, RN:

Board Authority

1. The Vermont State Board of Nursing (the "Board") has authority to issue warnings or reprimands; suspend, revoke, limit, or condition current licenses; or prevent the renewal of lapsed licenses if, after disciplinary hearing, the Board finds that the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct. 3 V.S.A. § 129(a); 3 V.S.A. § 129a; 3 V.S.A. § 814(d); 26 V.S.A. § 1582; the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing (the "ARBN"); and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.

Statement of Facts

2. Amy Joy Goodell (the "Respondent") of North Clarendon, Vermont is licensed by the State of Vermont as a Registered Nurse under license number 026.0027782. This license was originally issued on or about December 6, 2002 and is currently set to expire on or about March 31, 2011. Respondent is currently conditioned.
3. By way of history, on or about December 11, 2006, the Board summarily suspended Respondent's license, and thereafter, on or about May 16, 2007 pursuant to a Stipulation and Consent Order, Respondent's license was indefinitely suspended. Attachment A. This discipline was due in part to Respondent's diversion of Percocet and Dilaudid from Rutland Regional Medical Center. Attachment A.
4. By way of further history, on or about November 13, 2009 pursuant to a Reinstatement Stipulation and Consent Order (the "Reinstatement Order"), Respondent's license was reinstated with conditions. Attachment B. Respondent is currently conditioned pursuant to the Reinstatement Order.
5. Since the date of reinstatement, Respondent has failed to comply with the terms of the Reinstatement Order in part in the following ways:
 - a. Respondent has repeatedly failed to make daily calls to FirstLab for the required random urine screens.

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- b. Respondent has had a positive urine screen for Oxymorphone.
- c. Respondent failed to cause her provider to submit to the Board documentation regarding the necessity for a prescription of a controlled substance that would result in a positive urine screen for Oxymorphone
- d. Respondent failed to timely submit to the Board a treatment plan for pre-approval.
- e. Respondent failed to timely submit to the Board a list of the scheduled/controlled medications prescribed to her.
- f. Respondent has failed to cause her treating professional to timely submit monthly reports to the Board regarding her progress with the treatment plan.
- g. Respondent has failed to timely submit to the Board quarterly reports regarding her attendance at substance abuse recovery groups.

Charges

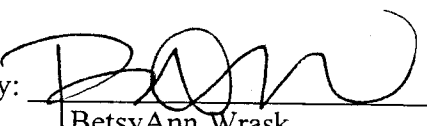
- 6. The act(s), omission(s), and/or circumstance(s) described above constitute grounds for discipline because the Respondent has committed unprofessional conduct in violation of:
 - a. 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(4) (Failing to comply with an order of the board or violating any term or condition of a license restricted by the board); and
 - b. 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(3) (Failing to comply with provisions of federal or state statutes or rules governing the practice of the profession).

Relief Requested

WHEREFORE, the license of Amy Joy Goodell should be revoked, suspended, reprimanded, conditioned, or otherwise disciplined.

STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER

STIPULATION

NOW COMES the State of Vermont, through State Prosecuting Attorney, Edward G. Adrian, and the Respondent, Amy Joy Goodell, who stipulate and agree as follows:

Board Authority

1. The Vermont State Board of Nursing (the Board) has authority to issue warnings or reprimands, suspend, revoke, limit, condition current licenses, or prevent the renewal of lapsed licenses if, after disciplinary hearing, the Board finds that the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct. 3 V.S.A. §129(a); 3 V.S.A. 129a; 3 V.S.A. §814(d); 26 V.S.A. §1582; the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing (ARBN); and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.

Statement of Facts

2. Amy Joy Goodell (the Respondent) of North Clarendon, Vermont is a registered nurse holding license number 026-0027782, issued by the State of Vermont. This license was originally issued on or about December 6, 2002. The Board summarily suspended the Respondent's license on or about December 11, 2006.

3. During all relevant times the Respondent was practicing as a Registered Nurse for Rutland Regional Medical Center (RRMC) in Rutland, Vermont.

4. On or about October 31, 2006 the Respondent admitted to diverting Percocet and Dilaudid from RRMC.

5. The Respondent also admitted to utilizing the access code of nurse J.M. to indicate that he was a witness to wasting of narcotic medications even though J.M. did not witness the wasting of the medications and was often not working on the nights his code was used.

6. A review of the RRMC records indicates that there were dozens of instances between August, 2006 and October, 2006 where J.M.'s code was utilized while he was not working and the Respondent was working. This includes dispensing of the drugs Morphine, Meperidine, Oxycodone (Percocet) and Hydromorphone (Dilaudid).

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7. A further review of the RRMC records also indicates that between August, 2006 and October, 2006 there were numerous instances where the Respondent was working and J.M. was not and J.M. was listed as dispensing a narcotic medication and the medication was indicated as wasted with the Respondent listed as the person observing the wasting of the medication.

8. On October 7-8, 2006, between the hours of 6:48 PM and 6:43 AM, the Omnicell machine shows twelve separate withdrawals of narcotic medications for patient S.M. The withdrawals were in the names of J.M. and the Respondent. There were eight different instances of wasting listing either J.M. or the Respondent. The only medication patient S.M. received during that time period was Morphine twice and Percocet once. The Respondent was working during that time period and J.M. was not working.

9. According to hospital records, the Respondent had the highest "doses per transaction day" for medications in RRMC in May, June and July 2006. The Respondent had the second highest "doses per transaction day" in August and September, 2006. These reports do not include medications that the Respondent checked out under the name of any other nurse in computing the "doses per transaction day".

10. This Stipulation is neither an admission of liability by the Respondent, nor a concession by the State of Vermont that its charges are not well founded. To avoid delay, uncertainty, inconvenience, and expense of protracted litigation of the charges above the Parties reach a full and final Stipulation pursuant to these understandings and the Order below.

Charges

11. The acts, omissions and/or circumstances described above constitute grounds for discipline because the Respondent has committed unprofessional conduct in violation of:

- i) 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(3) (failing to comply with provisions of federal or state statutes or rules governing the practice of the profession);
- ii) 3 V.S.A. § 129a(a)(7) (willfully making or filing false reports or records in the practice of the profession);
- iii) 26 V.S.A. § 1582(a)(3) (is unable to practice nursing competently by reason of any cause);
- iv) Vermont Board of Nursing Administrative Rules Chapter 4, Rule IV, II, C ("Any cause" includes, but is not limited to, reasons of physical or mental disability or use of drugs, narcotics, chemicals or any other type of materials);
- v) 26 V.S.A. § 1582(a)(5) (is habitually intemperate or is addicted to the use of habit forming drugs);
- vi) 26 V.S.A. § 1582(a)(7) (engages in conduct of a character likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public); and
- vii) 3 V.S.A. § 129a(b)(2) (failure to practice competently by reason of any cause on a single occasion or on multiple occasions may constitute unprofessional conduct.

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Failure to practice competently includes failure to conform to the essential standards of acceptable and prevailing practice).

Understandings

12. Respondent understands that the Nursing Board must review and accept the terms of the Consent Order. If the Board rejects any portion, the entire Stipulation and Consent Order shall be null and void.
13. Respondent specifically waives any claims that any disclosures made to the full Board during its review of this agreement have prejudiced her rights to a fair and impartial hearing in future hearings if this agreement is not accepted by the Board.
14. Respondent has read and reviewed this entire document and agrees that it contains the entire agreement between the parties.
15. Respondent is not under the influence of any drugs or alcohol at the time she signs this Stipulation and Consent Order.
16. Respondent voluntarily enters into this agreement after the opportunity to consult with legal counsel and is not being coerced by anyone into signing this Stipulation and Consent Order.
17. Respondent voluntarily waives her right to a contested hearing before the Board of Nursing and waives any right to appeal from this Stipulation and Consent Order.
18. The Respondent agrees that based on the facts set forth above and the charges below, that the State could meet its burden of proof if this matter was contested. Accordingly, the Respondent agrees that the Order set forth below may be entered by the Board.

ORDER

Based upon the stipulation above, it is **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

A. The Board of Nursing hereby **INDEFINITELY SUSPENDS THE RESPONDENT'S LICENSE**. Before applying for reinstatement, Respondent must obtain (1) an independent evaluation report by a licensed professional specializing in drug and alcohol abuse pre-approved by the Board; and (2) the results of the treatment with the drug and alcohol abuse evaluator must indicate that the Respondent does not present a risk to the safety, health or welfare of her potential patients. If reinstated, the Board may condition the Respondent's license as appropriate in order to protect the public pursuant to the Laws of the State of Vermont and the Rules of this Board.

B. Notwithstanding any provision above, the Respondent must continue to meet all Nursing Board requirements for maintaining a license, license renewal and license reinstatement.

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C. This Stipulation and Consent Order is a matter of public record and may be reported to other licensing authorities as provided in 3 V.S.A. §129(a).

D. This Stipulation and Consent Order will remain part of Respondent's licensing file and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.

REINSTATEMENT STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER

STIPULATION

NOW COME the State of Vermont, by and through State Prosecuting Attorney BetsyAnn Wrask, and the Respondent, Amy Joy Goodell, RN, who stipulate and agree as follows:

Board Authority

1. The Vermont State Board of Nursing (the "Board") has authority to issue warnings or reprimands; suspend, revoke, limit, or condition current licenses; or prevent the renewal of lapsed licenses if, after disciplinary hearing, the Board finds that the Respondent has engaged in unprofessional conduct. 3 V.S.A. § 129(a); 3 V.S.A. § 129a; 3 V.S.A. § 814(d); 26 V.S.A. § 1582; the Administrative Rules of the Board of Nursing (the "ARBN"); and the Rules of the Office of Professional Regulation.

Statement of Facts

2. Amy Joy Goodell (the "Respondent") of North Clarendon, Vermont is licensed by the State of Vermont as a Registered Nurse under license number 026.0027782. This license was originally issued on or about December 6, 2002 and lapsed on or about March 31, 2007.
3. By way of history, on or about December 11, 2006, the Board summarily suspended Respondent's license, and thereafter, on or about May 16, 2007 pursuant to a Stipulation and Consent Order, Respondent's license was indefinitely suspended. Attachment A. This discipline was due in part to Respondent's diversion of Percocet and Dilaudid from Rutland Regional Medical Center. Attachment A.
4. Pursuant to that Stipulation, before applying for reinstatement, Respondent was required to obtain an independent evaluation report by a licensed professional specializing in drug and alcohol abuse pre-approved by the Board, and the results of the independent evaluation report were required to indicate that the Respondent does not prevent a risk to the safety, health, or welfare of her potential patients. Attachment A.

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5. On or about November 9, 2008 in an Independent Evaluation, C.P., LADC, labeled Respondent's dependency on opiates as being in full remission. In a follow-up letter to the Board dated on or about September 14, 2009, C.P. stated that she was pleased with her observations of Respondent, and stated that Respondent does not present a risk to the safety, health or welfare of her potential patients.
6. On or about September 14, 2009 in a letter to the Board, Respondent requested that her license be reinstated.

Understandings

7. Respondent understands that the Nursing Board must review and accept the terms of the Consent Order. If the Board rejects any portion, the entire Stipulation and Consent Order shall be null and void.
8. Respondent specifically waives any claims that any disclosures made to the full Board during its review of this agreement have prejudiced her rights to a fair and impartial hearing in future hearings if this agreement is not accepted by the Board.
9. Respondent has read and reviewed this entire document and agrees that it contains the entire agreement between the parties.
10. Respondent is not under the influence of any drugs or alcohol at the time she signs this Stipulation and Consent Order.
11. Respondent voluntarily enters into this agreement after the opportunity to consult with legal counsel and is not being coerced by anyone into signing this Stipulation and Consent Order.
12. Respondent voluntarily waives her right to a contested hearing before the Board of Nursing and waives any right to appeal from this Stipulation and Consent Order.
13. Respondent agrees that the Order set forth below may be entered by the Board.

ORDER

Based on the Stipulation above, it is **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

- A. The Board of Nursing hereby **REINSTATES** Respondent's license to practice registered nursing and **CONDITIONS** Respondent's license **FOR A MINIMUM OF THREE (3) YEARS from the date of entry below**. The conditions are as follows:

- (1) Re-issue of License.

Upon the commencement of these conditions, Respondent shall be issued a license labeled "conditioned."

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(2) Length of Time of Conditions Imposed.

The conditions shall remain in place until Respondent has completed all conditions ordered. Respondent shall be subject to the conditions until Respondent completes a **minimum of three (3) years** of supervised registered nursing in which she works at least forty (40) hours every two (2) weeks as a registered nurse. Part time hours of less than forty (40) hours every two (2) weeks shall be credited on a prorated basis. Respondent shall be prohibited from working more than forty (40) hours per week.

(3) Completion of Substance Abuse Counseling and Treatment Plan.

Respondent shall enter into and continue substance abuse counseling with a treating professional pre-approved by the Board until the treating professional shall certify in writing to the Board that such counseling is no longer necessary. Respondent shall enter into and comply with the substance abuse treatment plan approved by the Board and the treating professional.

(4) Notification to Treating Professional.

Respondent shall provide a copy of this Stipulation and Consent Order to her treating professional and cause her treating professional to inform the Board, in writing and on professional letterhead, of receipt of the Stipulation and Consent Order and the treating professional's ability to comply with the conditions related to treatment and with all other terms of this Consent Order.

(5) Reports from Treating Professional.

Respondent shall authorize and cause her treating professional to submit to the Board evidence of satisfactory progress with the treatment plan during the effective period of this Consent Order. These reports shall be submitted in writing on forms issued by the Board. The first report is due commencing the month after the date of the commencement of the conditions and subsequent reports are due **monthly** thereafter.

Respondent shall authorize her treating professional to provide all information requested by the Nursing Board, either orally or in writing, at any time during the period this Consent Order is in effect.

(6) Participation in Recovery Group(s).

Respondent shall participate as recommended by her treating professional in substance abuse recovery group(s), and shall submit **quarterly** reports documenting such attendance on forms issued by the Board.

(7) Random Drug and Alcohol Testing.

Respondent shall submit to random drug and alcohol screenings at the request of the Board or its designee. Respondent shall designate a person, who has been pre-approved by the Board or its designee, to administer random drug and alcohol screens. All testing shall be done on a random, unannounced basis and analyzed by a lab qualified to analyze samples for forensic purposes and approved by the Board. All urine specimens collected for tests shall be collected in an observed setting. All screens shall be negative.

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Failure to appear for, refusal to provide, adulteration of, dilution of, or tampering with a sample for any urine screen shall cause that screen to be presumed positive. Any positive screen shall act as a violation of this Order.

(8) Abstain from Drug and Alcohol Use.

Respondent shall abstain completely from the consumption or possession of alcohol and drugs with the exception of medications as outlined in paragraph A.(9) for the period of time described in A.(2).

(9) Drug Use Exception.

Respondent shall not take controlled substances unless necessary. Respondent may take scheduled/controlled medications lawfully prescribed for a bona fide illness or condition by a physician, dentist, or nurse practitioner whose identity shall be made known to the Board in writing by Respondent within forty-eight (48) hours of the establishment of the practitioner/patient relationship. Respondent shall ensure that the physician, dentist or nurse practitioner informs the Board, in writing and on appropriate letterhead, of knowledge of Respondent's substance abuse issue(s) within one (1) week of entering into the practitioner/patient relationship. Respondent shall inform the Board in writing of all scheduled/controlled medications prescribed, including the name of the prescribing practitioner, within forty-eight (48) hours of receiving the prescription.

The Board or its designee may request at any time that the practitioner document the continued necessity for the prescribed scheduled/controlled medications if the term exceeds fourteen (14) days. This includes medications to be administered as necessary. It is not anticipated that Respondent would be prescribed scheduled/controlled medication during the term of this Consent Order for a period greater than fourteen (14) days, but if so, then the conditions herein may be revoked by the Board.

Respondent shall keep a written record of all medications taken, including over the counter drugs, and produce such record upon the request of the Board or its designee.

(10) Notification to Employers/Nursing School.

Respondent shall provide a copy of this Stipulation and Consent Order to all employers in any current or future setting in which Respondent practices as a registered nurse and inform them of Respondent's conditional license status.

Within ten (10) days of the date of entry of this Consent Order or of any subsequent registered nursing employment, Respondent shall cause Respondent's immediate supervisor to write to the Board, on the employer's letterhead, acknowledging receipt of the Stipulation and Consent Order and the ability to comply with the conditions in the Consent Order.

In the event the Respondent is attending a nursing program which has a clinical portion that involves actual patient care, Respondent shall provide a copy of the Stipulation and Consent Order to the Program Director. Respondent shall cause the Program Director to write to the Board, on school letterhead, acknowledging receipt of the Stipulation and Consent Order and the ability of the program to comply with the conditions in the Consent Order during clinical experience.

(11) Reports from Employers/Program Director.

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Within one (1) month of the date of reinstatement or within one (1) month of the commencement of registered nursing employment and **monthly** thereafter, Respondent shall cause every nursing employer the Respondent has worked for during the month to submit to the Board an evaluation of Respondent's work performance and attendance during that month. This report shall be submitted in writing on forms issued by the Board. All employer reports shall indicate satisfactory performance and attendance.

In the event the Respondent is attending a nursing program, Respondent shall cause the Program Director to submit to the Board, on a monthly basis, a written evaluation of her performance and attendance. This report shall be submitted in writing on forms issued by the Board and accompanied by a cover letter on the school's letterhead. All nursing program reports shall indicate satisfactory performance and attendance.

(12) Practice Under Supervision.

Respondent shall practice as a registered nurse only in a setting where Respondent has direct supervision for the entire shift by a licensed registered nurse that is in good standing with the Board.

(13) Administration of Medications.

Respondent is prohibited from administering any controlled substances. This condition may be removed only by the Respondent filing a petition with the Board after she has worked as a registered nurse for twelve (12) weeks for at least forty (40) hours every two weeks (or the part time equivalent) after the date of reinstatement.

In any such petition, the Respondent must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Nursing Board, that she can safely and competently administer such medications. In any such petition, the Respondent must include appropriate support from her treating professional and employer or nursing school administrator and a description of the documentation and inventory control procedures in place.

The removal of this prohibition shall not automatically result in the reinstatement of all medication privileges. The Board may gradually restore those privileges through whatever intermediary steps it determines are appropriate.

(14) Types of Employment Prohibited.

Respondent shall not work in a supervisory role. Respondent shall not work for a nurse registry, traveling nurse agency, float-pool, home health care agency, temporary nursing employment agency or as a private duty nurse or personal care provider during the effective period of this Consent Order.

(15) Interview with the Board or its Designee.

Respondent shall appear in person for interviews with the Board or its designee upon request.

(16) Out-of-State Practice.

Before any out-of-state practice can be credited toward fulfillment of these terms and conditions, Respondent shall first obtain approval from the Board prior to Respondent practicing nursing outside the State of Vermont. If Respondent fails to receive such approval before practicing nursing outside the State of Vermont, none of the time spent practicing

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nursing out-of-state will be credited toward the fulfillment of the terms and conditions of this Consent Order. The Board will approve out-of-state nursing practice so long as the Respondent can still comply with the provisions of this Consent Order.

(17) Notification of Place of Employment/Personal Address/Telephone Number.

Within five (5) days of the date of entry of this Consent Order, Respondent shall notify the Board, in writing, of her current place of employment, personal address, and telephone number. Respondent shall further notify the Board, in writing, within forty-eight (48) hours of any change in employment, personal address, or telephone number.

(18) Notification to Other States.

In the event that the Respondent is licensed in nursing in any other state(s), she must inform the nursing licensing board of the state(s) in which the Respondent is licensed of the conditional status of her Vermont registered nursing license within thirty (30) days of the date of entry of this Order. If the Respondent fails to provide such notification, it will be considered a violation of this Order.

(19) License Renewal.

If the Respondent's license expires while this Order is still in effect, this Order does not automatically extend the license. In that situation, in order to continue to practice as a registered nurse, the Respondent must timely apply for renewal, pay the applicable fee and demonstrate that she has otherwise complied with the requirements for license renewal.

(20) Release of Information Forms.

The conditions of this Order require the Respondent to authorize drug and/or alcohol treatment providers to report information in verbal and/or written format and/or to discuss the Respondent and any and all treatment rendered to the Respondent for drugs and/or alcohol with the Board or its designee. The conditions of this Order must allow any and all information from the Respondent's treatment providers to also be provided to the Office of Professional Regulation investigators and that the information may be used for further prosecutions if so warranted or if the Office of Professional Regulation determines that said information violates the terms of this Order or any rules or laws governing the profession of nursing.

The Respondent is entitled to revoke this consent at any time. However, any revocation by the Respondent of such consent to disclosure during the term of this Order shall be considered a violation of this Order.

This consent expires when the conditions are removed from the Respondent's registered nursing license.

This Stipulation and Consent Order shall constitute a valid written consent pursuant to the requirements of 42 C.F.R. § 2.31.

The Respondent understands that her treatment provider may require her to sign a separate and distinct consent meeting the requirements of 42 C.F.R. § 2.31.

(21) Costs.

The Respondent shall bear all costs of complying with this Consent Order.

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(22) Violation of this Order.

If the Respondent violates the terms of this Order in any respect, the Board, after giving the Respondent notice and an opportunity to be heard, may rescind or modify this Order and impose additional appropriate disciplinary actions. If a complaint of unprofessional conduct is made against the Respondent during the term of this Order, this Order shall be automatically extended until the unprofessional conduct matter is concluded.

(23) Completion of Conditional License Period.

After the conditional license period, the Respondent may petition the Board to remove any and all conditions on her license. The Respondent must present proof that she has fully complied with the terms of this Order. The Respondent must also present proof of successful substance abuse rehabilitation and she must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Board, that she poses no danger to the public or the practice of registered nursing and that she can safely and competently perform the duties of a licensed registered nurse.

- B. Notwithstanding any provision above, the Respondent must continue to meet all Nursing Board requirements for maintaining a license, license renewal and license reinstatement.
- C. This Stipulation and Consent Order is a matter of public record and may be reported to other licensing authorities as provided in 3 V.S.A. §129(a).
- D. This Stipulation and Consent Order will remain part of Respondent's licensing file and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.
