STIPULATION AND CONSENT ORDER

STIPULATION

NOW COME the State of Vermont, through its Attorney General William H. Sorrell, and Respondent Anne Roderick, and stipulate and agree as follows:

1. The Vermont Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to investigate and adjudicate allegations of unprofessional conduct committed by nurses and nursing assistants pursuant to 3 V.S.A. §§129, 129a; 26 V.S.A. §§1574, 1582, 1595 and 1598; the Board of Nursing's Rules and the Office of Professional Regulation's Rules.
2. Respondent Anne Roderick, of New York City, New York, is a registered nurse holding license number 351493, issued by the State of New York on about October 15, 1982, which is currently active. Further, she is a licensed practical nurse holding license number no. 136064, issued by the State of New York on about July 20, 1979, which is not currently active.
3. Respondent admits that on about October 26, 1990, a consent order was entered in the State of New York suspending her licenses for two years, with execution of the suspensions stayed in lieu of two years of probation. The probation included: notification to authorities of employment changes; enrollment with the Division of Substance Abuse Services, and quarterly employer reports (New York State

Education Department, Office of Professional Discipline, State Board for Nursing Calendar Nos. 11126 and 10701, which is incorporated by reference).

4. Respondent admits that on about November 20, 2000, she prepared, signed and/or filed an Application for Registration and Licensure by Endorsement with the Vermont Secretary of State, Office of Professional Regulation (thus, she is both an "Applicant" and "Respondent"). She indicated, "No" when asked, "Has any state or federal licensing authority restricted, suspended, revoked or taken other disciplinary action against a license, certificate, or registration that you hold or held in any professional occupation?"
5. Respondent admits the conclusions of unprofessional conduct as set forth below in the Board's Order.
6. Respondent understands that the Nursing Board must review and accept the terms of the Consent Order. If the Board rejects any portion, the entire Stipulation and Consent Order shall be null and void.
7. Respondent has read and reviewed this entire document and agrees that it contains the entire agreement between the parties.
8. Respondent waives any notification period and agrees to have this document reviewed by the Board during the next available meeting. Respondent specifically waives any claims that any disclosures made to the full Board during its review of this agreement have prejudiced her rights to a fair and impartial hearing in future hearings if this agreement is not accepted by the Board.
9. Respondent is not under the influence of any drugs or alcohol at the time she signs this Stipulation and Consent Order.

10. Respondent voluntarily enters this agreement after the opportunity to consult with legal counsel and is not being coerced by anyone into signing this Stipulation and Consent Order.
11. Respondent voluntarily waives her right to charges and a contested hearing before the Board of Nursing.
12. Respondent agrees that the Board may set forth the order below.

ORDER

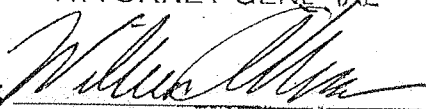
Based on the stipulation above it is **ORDERED AND ADJUDGED** as follows:

- A. By engaging in the conduct above, Respondent acted unprofessionally pursuant to, and in violation of 26 VSA § 1582(a)(1) (Has made or caused to be made a false...statement or representation in procuring or attempting to procure registration or renew a license to practice nursing).
- B. The Nursing Board hereby **DENIES** Respondent's license application.
- C. This Stipulation and Consent Order is a matter of public record and may be reported to other licensing authorities as provided in 3 V.S.A. §129(a).
- D. This Stipulation and Consent Order will remain part of Respondent's licensing file and may be used for purposes of determining sanctions in any future disciplinary matter.

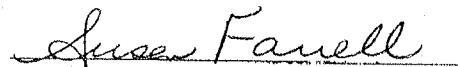
