RE: REMINDER TO COMPLETE TWO HOURS OF CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE CE

Effective with the passage in Act 173 (2016), Sec. 9, Office of Professional Regulation (OPR) licensees with a registration number from the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), or who have a pending application for a DEA number, or who dispense controlled substances, shall **complete at least two hours of continuing education as a condition of license renewal**, on the topics of:

- the abuse and diversion, safe use, and appropriate storage and disposal of controlled substances;
- the appropriate use of the Vermont Prescription Monitoring System;
- risk assessment for abuse or addiction;
- pharmacological and nonpharmacological alternatives to opioids for managing pain;
- medication tapering and cessation of the use of controlled substances; and,
- relevant State and federal laws and regulations concerning the prescription of opioid controlled substance.

Qualifying controlled-substances courses may be counted toward general continuing education requirements. Documentation must be uploaded to the online licensing platform with your renewal application. Check your license expiration date and begin planning now.
